Instructions for Clearing
Statistics Deficiency***

Statistics Deficiency: A deficiency in statistics has been identified by the School of Social Work Admissions Committee. To clear this deficiency, students admitted to the Master of Social Work (MSW) program must demonstrate that they have successfully completed a baccalaureate course in statistics **by the date set forth in the Graduate Education's offer of admission**. To fulfill this deficiency it is recommended that an undergraduate introductory statistics course be completed.

1. A three-credit-hour internet course (non letter graded) is offered by the School of Social Work entitled **SWU 394 Statistics for Social Work** during the eight-week session of summer school.

OR

2. You may complete a statistics course at any community college or university. For example, PSY 230 or MAT 206 from a Maricopa County Community College or PSY 230, MAT 167 or BUS 205 from Pima Community College.

OR

3. You may complete an internet statistics course. For example, PSY 230 or MAT 206 from Rio Salado Community College. www.rio.maricopa.edu

OR

4. You may complete an online self-guided prerequisite course, Statistics for People Who (Think They) Hate Statistics, from the University of Louisville. Currently the cost is \$175 plus the textbook. http://reg.abcsignup.com/reg/event_page.aspx?ek=0015-0015-59a0aa8e52fc49da8308e7c85b83395a

OR

5. You may complete an online Introduction to Statistics course offered through Texas State University. Currently the cost is \$119. Session is six weeks with variable start dates.
